The Labelling of Food (Amendment) Regulations, 1958

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Minister of Health, acting jointly, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 7 and 123 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1955(a), and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, having consulted with such organisations as appear to them to be representative of interests substantially affected by these Regulations and having referred a draft of these Regulations to the Food Hygiene Advisory Council in accordance with section 82 of the said Act, hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Labelling of Food (Amendment) Regulations, 1958 ; and shall come into operation on the 3rd day of May, 1958.

2. The Labelling of Food Order, 1953(b) as amended(c), shall be further amended by deleting therefrom paragraph (d) of Article 8 thereof.

S T A T U T E S
E X P L A N A T O R Y N O T E

(This Note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These amending Regulations, which apply in England and Wales only, revoke Article 8 (d) of the Labelling of Food Order, 1953 (which Order has effect in England and Wales as if contained in Regulations under section 7 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1955) thereby removing the requirement that no liquor shall be labelled as a cocktail or as a mixture containing spirits unless it contains not less than 40 per cent. proof spirit.
