Programme information and content

The CertHE in Leadership and Strategic Studies aims to provide selected army officers with the early stage of Undergraduate higher education provision to support their service requirements and to enable them to act as effective officers of the British Army. This degree will be available to non graduates, or equivalent, entrants to the Army Officer Commissioning Course (CC) at the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst.

The CertHE is validated at Level 4 by the University of Reading with provision carried out entirely by the academic and officer tutors at the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst. The CC comprises a combination of academic and applied learning modules broadly covering Leadership, Communication and Behavioural Science (CABS), Defence and International Affairs (DIA) and War Studies (WS).

The CC is conducted over a 44 week period in a very intense programme.

During the course of the Programme, you will have the opportunity to develop a range of skills, knowledge and attributes (known as learning outcomes) For this programme, these are:

Learning outcomes

Assess and articulate your own roles and responsibilities within your organisation in $\frac{1}{2}$ the context of being an effective global citizen. This includes identifying your

- ² specific contributions to organisational goals and the broader impact of your roles in a global context. Show flexibility and a readiness to adapt to change.
- Assess the importance of ongoing professional development and learning in your 3 chosen field, and critically analyse how this dedication to personal growth contributes value to both yourself and your organisation.

Demonstrate confident and credible communication skills when interacting with both 4 specialists and non-specialists. This includes effectively questioning, actively

- listening, and efficiently managing differences and conflicts.
- Analyse and enhance your career prospects, both within the Army and in broader 5 professional fields, by assessing your discipline-based skills and cultivating your employability potential.

You will be expected to engage in learning activities to achieve these Programme learning outcomes. Assessment of your modules will reflect these learning outcomes and test how far you have met the requirements for your degree.

To pass the Programme, you will be required to meet the progression or accreditation and award criteria set out below.
