Programme information and content

The PGCAP is a 60-credit Level 7 part-time, taught postgraduate, work-based learning programme which aims to support the initial and continuing professional development of staff engaged in teaching and supporting learning in the University. This programme equips you with the knowledge and skills required to become an effective, inclusive and reflective practitioner. The programme covers a variety of pedagogic theories, principles and practices to allow you to evaluate and develop your academic practice.

Throughout the programme there are opportunities to apply your learning to your own context and signature pedagogies as well as to learn from your peers about their own practice. The programme will cover all aspects of the student learning journey including how students learn, how to design effective sessions, successful assessment and feedback strategies, module and programme design principles and opportunities throughout to reflect on your teaching in light of student and mentor feedback.

The programme is accredited by Advance HE. Successful completion of the full programme (all three modules) leads to a postgraduate qualification in education (the PGCAP) and recognition as an HEA Fellow (FHEA) as you evidence achievement of Descriptor 2 of the Professional Standards Framework (PSF 2023). The framework's core dimensions: Professional Values, Areas of Activity and Core Knowledge are aligned to the programme's learning, teaching and assessment activities.

You will be expected to engage in learning activities to achieve these Programme learning outcomes. Assessment of your modules will reflect these learning outcomes and test how far you have met the requirements for your degree.

| The programme is studied on a part-time basis, with the content delivered in intensive teaching blocks and through a combination of face to face and digitally enabled teaching. In order to progress onto the optional third module, EDMAPR, students must pass the first and second modules, EDMAPI and EDMAPD (40 Level 7 credits). | | | |

Optional modules

All three modules are compulsory to attain the full Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice. In order to progress to EDMAPR students must have a pass in EDMAPI and EDMAPD.

Teaching and learning delivery

The programme is targeted at early career academic staff and/or those who are new to teaching in the UK. The programme is designed to allow colleagues from all disciplines across the campus to accommodate the block days of teaching into their schedule, by offering a combination of face to face and online taught days outside of the University's main teaching weeks.

The programme is taught through interactive workshops incorporating group work, the sharing of practice, problem-solving and the use of case studies. Elements of your programme are delivered via digital technology using a range of synchronous and asynchronous delivery, as well as face to face classroom teaching. You will undertake self-scheduled T&L activities, including peer review, and as a work-based practice course, you will also be expected to undertake guided independent study. Information about module study hours including contact hours and the amount of independent study which you are normally expected to undertake for a module is indicated in the relevant module description.

The taught days offer participants the opportunity to experience life as a University of Reading student, through a variety of lectures, seminars, applied workshops, assessment procedures and the use of Blackboard. We use an experiential loop input approach (Woodward 2003) in all of our teaching, which aligns the content and process of learning, enabling participants to both experience and reflect upon the processes of teaching and learning as they undertake the programme.

The programme is delivered by members of the Academic Development and Enhancement team (ADE) from the Centre of Quality, Support and Development (CQSD). Our staff have vast and varied experiences of teaching and learning across a range of settings in Higher Education both internationally and from within the UK.

Accreditation details

EDMAPI is accredited by Advance HE at Descriptor 1 of the UKPSF, so that successful completion of this module results in the award of HEA Associate Fellowship (AFHEA).

EDMAPI and EDMAPD are accredited by Advance HE at Descriptor 2 of the UKPSF, so that successful completion of both modules results in the award of full HEA Fellowship (FHEA).

Assessment

The programme is assessed through a combination of written coursework, reflective tasks, peer review, and evidence-based presentation. Further information is contained in the individual module descriptions.

Progression

Part-time and modular progression requirements

In order to progress onto EDMAPD students must have a pass in EDMAPI provided that you fulfil the module eligibility requirements and in agreement with your Head of School.

In order to progress onto EDMAPR students must have a pass in EDMAPI and EDMAPD.

Classification

All assessments must achieve a Pass in order to fulfil the requirements of Descriptor 2

In addition, students must pass all elements of EDMAPI and EDMAPD in order to achieve D2 and gain recognition (full Fellowship) FHEA.

Students must pass all elements of EDMAPI, EDMAPD and EDMAPR to achieve award of Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice (PGCAP).
